TITLE: General Manager's Report – February 2020

SUBJECT: Update on activities since the January 2020 Board of Trustees Meeting

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This Staff Report is intended to report the noteworthy activities and events of the District. Noteworthy activity from January included continued coordination on Natomas Levee Improvement Project with the United States Army Corps of Engineers, SAFCA and others and introduction of Assembly Bill 1958 (Cooper/McCarty). In summary, the District had a productive and successful month. Our key activities and achievements are presented below:

BACKGROUND:

1. Administration Services

- a. <u>Human Resources</u>
 - i. Working with Byrce Consulting to perform job analysis and salary survey for Administrative Assistant position.

2. District Operations

- a. Flood Operations:
 - i. To date the District has not performed any flood operations since the Flood Season began on November 1, 2019. River elevations have remained very low as compared to this time last year.

3. Development Projects

- a. Sutter Pointe Phase I
 - i. GM King working with Sutter Pointe Phase I Landowners and Project Agents to review of Proposed Development Project.

4. Capital Improvement Projects

- a. <u>SCADA</u>:
 - i. All site work complete, except for minor punch list items.
 - ii. TESCO and ATEEM provided recommendations to resolve tablet resolution issues and provide multiple remote access sessions. Final decision pending discussions at progress meeting on 2/12/2020.
 - iii. TESCO and ATEEM provided feedback and provided independent recommendations to resolve communication bandwidth issues between Base Station PC and Remote PLCs. TESCO recommends changing communication protocol with continued polling from the Base Station PC

based on bench testing performed. ATEEM has reaffirmed position to poll between PLCs in a Master/Slave configuration. Follow-up discussions scheduled for progress meeting to clarify outstanding concerns and questions. Final direction to be determined thereafter.

iv. Integration with Natomas Mutual Water Company's SCADA system is on hold until communication issue is resolved.

b. <u>CIP Update</u>

- i. District entered into Professional Services Agreement with KSN, Inc. on November 12, 2019. A kickoff meeting with held on December 2, 2019.
- ii. Condition Assessment and Facility Inventory finalized in December 2019.
- iii. KSN continues to make progress towards completion of the CIP Update by May 2020.

In response, the District immediately removed all accessible debris from the areas of

concern and with the help of Sacramento Police Department, noticed and removed the encampments in order for the District to perform operations and maintenance. The District also installed additional fencing to prevent/limit access between the bridges.

Dear Kevin,

We wanted to thank you for providing the board with an incident report regarding the SCADA system failure on December 2, 2019. We were fortunate that staff was alert and decided to monitor the canal water levels independent of the SCADA system and initiate the pumps via manual control.

However, the fact that the system failure was not isolated to just one pumping plant raises several concerns with the installation and operation of the SCADA system. If it had occurred at one, maybe two pumping stations, it might be considered coincidental. But for it to have impacted all the district plants means it may have been a design flaw, installation error, poor project management oversight or any combination of these factors.

To help belay any lingering concerns about the SCADA system operability, we would ask you to consider the following:

- 1. Prior to accepting the completed SCADA system from the contractor, perform an independent design review and testing of the system by someone not directly involved in the project management, system installation or RD 1000 staff.
- Explore the recommendation by staff to install water level monitors and an alarming system as a back-up should the pumps fail to start when set in auto mode in the future. We recommend this alarm system be independent of the SCADA system.

Thank you in advance for considering these suggestions on the SCADA system.

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATURE-2019-20 REGULAR SESSION

ASSEMBLY BILL

No. 1958

Introduced by Assembly Members Cooper and McCarty (Coauthors: Assembly Members Flora and Gallagher) (Coauthors: Senators Dodd and Pan)

January 17, 2020

An act to amend Section 8720 of, to add Section 8540 to, and to repeal and add Section 8712 of, the Water Code, relating to flood control, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1958, as introduced, Cooper. State Plan of Flood Control: facilities.

Existing law establishes the Central Valley Flood Protection Board and authorizes the board to engage in various flood control activities along the Sacramento River, the San Joaquin River, their tributaries, and related areas. Existing law requires every plan of reclamation, flood control, drainage, improvement, dredging, or work, that includes or contemplates the construction, enlargement, revetment, or alteration of any levee, embankment, canal, or other excavation in the bed of or along or near the banks of the Sacramento or San Joaquin Rivers or any of their tributaries or connected therewith, upon any land adjacent thereto, within any of the overflow basins thereof, or upon any land susceptible to overflow therefrom, to be approved by the board before construction is commenced. Existing law prohibits a levee along a river or bypass at any of those specified places, or any levee forming part of any adopted flood control plan, from being cut or altered without permission of the board. Existing law makes a violation of the latter provisions a misdemeanor.

This bill would instead prohibit a person from concealing, defacing, destroying, modifying, cutting, altering, or physically or visually obstructing any levee along a river or bypass at any of those specified places, any levee forming part of any flood control plan, or any other facility of the State Plan of Flood Control, including, but not limited to, any and all associated rights of way, without permission of the board. By expanding the behavior that would be punishable as a misdemeanor, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. The bill would authorize the board or its designee, or a local agency that maintains the levee or facility, to inspect and remove any physical or visual obstructions placed or alterations made on any of the above-specified levees or facilities, including, but not limited to, any and all associated rights of way. 

Safety Topics for the Month of January

Unauthorized encampment clean-up – use caution when handling debris for your protection.

District Complaints

For the month of January, the District received eight complaints. Four complaints were reported regarding illegal dumping and trash debris from unauthorized encampments. The District informed the callers that we are actively working with City/County officials regarding encampments and have removed debris from illegal dumping activity as well as abandoned encampment sites. The District received one call regarding aquatic vegetation concerns in District canals. The District currently has the locations on their current maintenance rotation schedule. The District received two complaints regarding a damaged fence near the La Lima subdivision. Foreman Del Castillo worked with one of the residents to locate and repair the damaged fence. The District also received a call from an area resident with concerns about the District's use of squirrel bait (diphacinone); Superintendent Caldwell confirmed that the District remains in compliance with California law regarding the use of Diphacinone within the District.



The District is required by law to have a minimum of six (6) months operation and maintenance reserves. Additionally, the District needs six (6) months of Operations and Maintenance (O/M) reserves to pay expenses from July through December when the 1st installments are collected on property assessments. The annual O/M budget is approximately \$2 million per year.

SUBJECT:	Review and Accept Report for January 2020

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This Staff Report is intended to provide a monthly budgetary snapshot of how well the District is meeting its set budget goals for the fiscal year. The monthly Budget to Actual Report contains a three-column presentation of actual expenditures, budgeted expenditures, and percentage of the budget. Each line item compares budgeted amounts against actual to date expenses. Significant budgeted line item variances (if any) will be explained in the Executive Summary of this report.

Attachment 1 provides a fiscal year to date report for the month ending January 31, 2020. Administrative costs exceeding 60% are due to one-time annual budgeted expenses including District memberships, property taxes and our annual liability and auto insurance policies.

BACKGROUND:

The Board of Trustees adopts a budget annually in June. District staff prepares the Budget, which shows current year budget versus expenditures and a proposed budget for the next fiscal year.

Three committees review the draft budget before being presented to the Board for adoption in June. The Personnel Committee reviews the wage and benefits portion of the Budget. The Operations Committee reviews the Capital expenditures Budget. After the two committees review and make recommendations to the budget, the final draft is prepared for the Finance Committee to consider. After review by the Finance Committee, the final Budget is presented to the Board for adoption at a regular Board meeting.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board review and accept the Budget to Actual Report for January 2020.

TITLE: Authorization to Acquire Property

SUBJECT: Review and Consider Authorizing General Manager to Acquire Property (APN 274-0190-001).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

APN 274-0190-001, adjacent to the Natomas East Main Drain Canal (NEMDC) east levee is currently owned by Sacramento County (Regional Parks) and fully encumbered by a flood control easement in favor of RD 1000. A portion of property is necessary for the proposed Corps Natomas Levee Improvements (Reach H) and several adjacent properties have encroached into the County's parcel with fences, buildings and other encroachments. SAFCA and RD 1000 staff approached Sacramento County to deed title to the property to RD 1000 and County Parks staff have agreed to recommend this to their Board of Supervisors. SAFCA had an appraisal done of property—valued at \$10,000 as "open space". In addition, the District agreed to fund County staff time to prepare and process the documents at a cost not to exceed \$5000. SAFCA funded a Phase I Environmental Assessment by AECOM which did not identify any "recognized environmental conditions" of concern and recommended no further action. SAFCA recently purchased the property at 200 Cleveland Street (most significant encroachment) and has removed the structure. SAFCA has agreed to work with the District to address the remaining encroachments onto this parcel.

Attached is the proposed Sales and Purchase Agreement as well as the Grant Deed for the parcel. The Grant Deed is written in a way to preserve the District's underlying historical easement while acquiring title to the parcel.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to execute the attached Purchase and Sales Agreement and accept the Grant Deed. Staff is recommending the purchase of the fee title notwithstanding the existing flood control easement in favor of the District for the following considerations. Fee title will 1) facilitate the final right of way acquisition necessary for the Corps Natomas Levee project; 2) strengthen the District's real property interest to avoid future encroachments; 3) provide additional area to facilitate our future operation and maintenance, capital projects and flood emergency response including use as a staging area for these purposes; 4) position the District to remediate the remaining encroachments and avoid costs having to involve Sacramento County in the process.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The District's direct costs would be \$15,000 of which \$5000 has been approved prior and been paid to the County for preparation and processing the agreement and deed. The District will

incur future operations and maintenance costs for this parcel, though our field staff currently does a portion of this work as part of our flood control easement responsibility.

SALES AND PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Sales and Purchase Agreement, (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement"), dated for convenience as of _______, (hereinafter referred to as "Agreement Date"), is made by and between the COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO, a political subdivision of the State of California, (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY") and the RECLAMATION DISTRICT NO. 1000, a reclamation district created by act of the legislature of the State of California, approved April 8, 1911, a public agency, (hereinafter referred to as "RD1000"), in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, and is subject to the conditions set forth below, and is made with reference to the following facts:

RECITALS

A. COUNTY is the owner of fee title to that certain real property located along the land side of East Levee Road between Cleveland Avenue and Jefferson Avenue in the incorporated City of Sacramento, California, 95833, known as Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 274-0190-001, consisting of approximately 2.067 acres of land, together with all improvements, fixtures and personal property thereon, and all rights, hereditaments, easements, appurtenances thereto belonging or otherwise appertaining, all of which is more particularly described in **Exhibit "A"** and depicted in **Exhibit "B"**, which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (hereinafter referred to as the "**Property**"); and

B. RD1000 desires to purchase from COUNTY and COUNTY desires to sell to RD1000 the Property, pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS.

The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated by reference.

2. PURCHASE AND SALE.

COUNTY hereby agrees to sell and convey, and RD1000 hereby agrees to purchase for the purchase price and upon the terms and conditions herein stated, the Property described above.

3. CONSIDERATION.

a. **Purchase Price**. The purchase price for the Property shall be TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$10,000.00) (hereinafter referred to as the "**Purchase Price**"). RD1000 shall remit payment of the Purchase Price to COUNTY within five (5) business days of the date this Agreement is fully executed. RD1000 shall make all payments to the County of Sacramento, Department of Regional Parks at 10361 Rockingham Drive, Sacramento, CA 95827.

b. **Administrative Charges.** The parties acknowledge that RD1000 has paid to COUNTY a non-refundable administrative payment in the amount of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$5,000.00) via check no. 40206 to cover COUNTY Real Estate staff time to facilitate the Property conveyance and obtain approval from the COUNTY Board of Supervisors.

4. QUITCLAIM DEED.

COUNTY shall execute and record the Quitclaim Deed, in substantially the same form as set forth in **Exhibit "C"**, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, conveying title to the Property to RD1000. RD1000 shall execute a Certificate of Acceptance for said Quitclaim Deed and provide to COUNTY prior to recordation.

5. TITLE AND ENCUMBRANCES.

COUNTY is the fee owner of the Property. RD1000 shall take title to the Property subject to any and all encumbrances.

6. AS-IS SALE.

RD1000 acknowledges that, except as expressly contained in this Agreement, neither COUNTY nor anyone acting for or on behalf of the COUNTY has made any representation, warranty or promise to RD1000 concerning the physical aspects or condition of the Property; the feasibility or desirability of the Property for any particular use; the conditions of soils, sub-soils, groundwater and surface waters; or the presence or absence of any other physical aspect of the Property; and that in entering into the Agreement, RD1000 has not relied on any representation, statement or warranty of COUNTY or anyone acting for or on behalf of COUNTY, other than as may be expressly contained in this Agreement, and that all matters concerning the Property shall be independently verified by RD1000 and that RD1000 shall purchase the Property on RD1000's own

examination thereof; and that if RD1000 elects to acquire the Property, is purchasing the Property in its "as is" condition and its "as is" state of repair as of the date of recordation of the Quitclaim Deed.

7. POSSESSION.

COUNTY will deliver possession of the Property to RD1000 on the date of recordation of the Quitclaim Deed.

8. BINDING.

The terms and conditions of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

9. CONTINGENCY.

It is understood and agreed between the parties that the completion of this transaction is contingent upon the specific approval and authorization by the COUNTY's Board of Supervisors and RD1000 Board of Directors of this Agreement and Quitclaim Deed.

10. NOTICE.

All notices or other communications required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing, and shall be personally delivered or sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, and shall be deemed received upon the earlier of (i) if personally delivered, the date of delivery to the address of the person to receive such notice, or (ii) if mailed, on the date of posting by the United States Post Office.

- b. **Waivers.** No waiver of any breach of any covenant or provision hereof shall be deemed a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach hereof, or of any other covenant or provision herein contained. No extension of time for performance of any obligation or act shall be deemed an extension of the time for performance of any other obligation or act except those of the waiving party, which shall be extended by a period of time equal to the period of delay.



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EXHIBIT "B" to Agreement Plat Map









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TITLE: Authorization to Accept Easement

SUBJECT: Review and Consider Adoption of Resolution No. 2020-02-01 Authorizing the General Manager to Accept Grant of Easement Deed from City of Sacramento.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City of Sacramento (City) acquired drainage easements from the underlying property owners that allowed for the expansion and improvements to the Reclamation District No. 1000 (District) B Drain. The improvements were necessary to allow for the continued development of South and North Natomas. The District held an historic easement that encumbered a narrow corridor that does not correspond to the full footprint of the current drainage improvements. The City and District staffs agree it is appropriate to transfer the drainage easements to the District who operates and maintains the B Drain and associated levee improvements. The City is looking to sell the property and agrees the easement transfer should occur prior to the sale.

Attached is the proposed easement language provided by the District and the legal description of the easement area created by the City. The City Council will need to approve the Grant of Easement.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board Adopt Resolution No. 2020-02-01 Authorizing the General Manager to Accept the Grant of Easement Deed from City of Sacramento, in substantial conformance with the attached document and legal description upon approval by the City Council.

None as the District currently operates and maintains the facilities encumbered by the easement.





Since 1987, the Director of Finance has submitted a statement of investment policy to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors for consideration and adoption. The Board of Supervisors approved the enclosed calendar year 2020 investment policy on December 17, 2019.

The 2020 investment policy removes the \$10 million limit on investments made through the Community Reinvestment Act Program to allow for more deposits in the program without increasing risk or compromising policy objectives.

I recommend that the legislative body of your agency receive and file the enclosed Sacramento County Annual Investment Policy of the Pooled Investment Fund — Calendar Year 2020 at its next regular meeting. Your action to receive and file the policy constitutes consideration at a public meeting as recommended by Government Code section 53646(a)(2). The investment policy is also available on the Department of Finance – Investment Division webpage at www.finance.saccounty.net/investments.

I. Authority

Under the Sacramento County Charter, the Board of Supervisors established the position of Director of Finance and by ordinance will annually review and renew the Director of Finance's authority to invest and reinvest all the funds in the County Treasury.

11. Policy Statement

This Investment Policy (Policy) establishes cash management and investment guidelines for the Director of Finance, who is responsible for the stewardship of the Sacramento County Pooled Investment Fund. Each transaction and the entire portfolio must comply with California Government Code and this Policy. All portfolio activities will be judged by the standards of the Policy and its investment objectives. Activities that violate its spirit and intent will be considered contrary to the Policy.

III. Standard of Care

The Director of Finance is the Trustee of the Pooled Investment Fund and therefore, a fiduciary subject to the prudent investor standard. The Director of Finance, employees involved in the investment process, and members of the Sacramento County Treasury Oversight Committee (Oversight Committee) shall refrain from all personal business activities that could conflict with the management of the investment program. All individuals involved will be required to report all gifts and income in accordance with California state law. When investing, reinvesting, purchasing, acquiring, exchanging, selling and managing public funds, the Director of Finance shall act with care, skill, prudence, and diligence to meet the aims of the investment objectives listed in Section IV, Investment Objectives.

IV. Investment Objectives

The Pooled Investment Fund shall be prudently invested in order to earn a reasonable return, while awaiting application for governmental purposes. The specific objectives for the Pooled Investment Fund are ranked in order of importance.

A. Safety of Principal

The preservation of principal is the primary objective. Each transaction shall seek to ensure that capital losses are avoided, whether they be from securities default or erosion of market value.

B. Liquidity

As a second objective, the Pooled Investment Fund should remain sufficiently flexible to enable the Director of Finance to meet all operating requirements that may be reasonably anticipated in any depositor's fund.

C. Public Trust

In managing the Pooled Investment Fund, the Director of Finance and the authorized investment traders should avoid any transactions that might impair public confidence in Sacramento County and the participating local agencies. Investments should be made with precision and care, considering the probable safety of the capital as well as the probable income to be derived.

D. Maximum Rate of Return

As the fourth objective, the Pooled Investment Fund should be designed to attain a market average rate of return through budgetary and economic cycles, consistent with the risk limitations, prudent investment principles and cash flow characteristics identified herein. For comparative purposes, the State of California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) will be used as a performance benchmark. The Pooled Investment Fund quarterly performance benchmark target has been set at or above LAIF's yield. This benchmark was chosen because LAIF's portfolio structure is similar to the Pooled Investment Fund.

V. Pooled Investment Fund Investors

The Pooled Investment Fund investors are comprised of Sacramento County, school and community college districts, districts directed by the Board of Supervisors, and independent special districts whose treasurer is the Director of Finance. Any local agencies not included in this category are subject to California Government Code section 53684 and are referred to as outside investors.

VI. Implementation

In order to provide direction to those responsible for management of the Pooled Investment Fund, the Director of Finance has established this Policy and will provide it to the Oversight Committee and render it to legislative bodies of local agencies that participate in the Pooled Investment Fund. In accordance with California Government Code section 53646, et seq., the Board of Supervisors shall review and approve this Policy annually.

This Policy provides a detailed description of investment parameters used to implement the investment process and includes the following: investable funds; authorized instruments; prohibited investments; credit requirements; maximum maturities and concentrations; repurchase agreements; Community Reinvestment Act Program; criteria and qualifications of broker/dealers and direct issuers; investment guidelines, management style and strategy; Approved Lists; and calculation of yield and costs.

VII. Internal Controls

The Director of Finance shall establish internal controls to provide reasonable assurance that the investment objectives are met and to ensure that the assets are protected from loss, theft, or misuse. To assist in implementation and internal controls, the Director of Finance has established an Investment Group and a Review Group.

The Investment Group, which is comprised of the Director of Finance and his/her designees, is responsible for maintenance of the investment guidelines and Approved Lists. These guidelines and lists can be altered daily, if needed, to adjust to the ever-changing financial markets. The guidelines can be more conservative or match the policy language. In no case can the guidelines override the Policy.

The Review Group, which is comprised of the Director of Finance and his/her designees, is responsible for the monthly review and appraisal of all the investments purchased by the Director of Finance and staff. This review includes bond proceeds, which are invested separately from the Pooled Investment Fund and are not governed by this Policy.

The Director of Finance shall establish a process for daily, monthly, quarterly, and annual review and monitoring of the Pooled Investment Fund activity. The following articles, in order of supremacy, govern the Pooled Investment Fund:

- 1. California Government Code
- 2. Annual Investment Policy
- 3. Current Investment Guidelines
- 4. Approved Lists (see page 9, Section IX.K)

The Director of Finance shall review the daily investment activity and corresponding bank balances.

Monthly, the Review Group shall review all investment activity and its compliance to the corresponding governing articles and investment objectives.

Quarterly, the Director of Finance will provide the Oversight Committee with a copy of the Pooled Investment Fund activity and its compliance to the annual Policy and California Government Code.

Annually, the Oversight Committee shall cause an annual audit of the activities within the Pooled Investment Fund to be conducted to determine compliance to the Policy and California Government Code. This audit will include issues relating to the structure of the investment portfolio and risk.

All securities purchased, with the exception of bank deposits, money market mutual funds, and LAIF, shall be delivered to the independent third-party custodian selected by the Director of Finance. This includes all collateral for repurchase agreements. All trades, where applicable, will be executed by delivery versus payment by the designated third-party custodian.

VIII. Sacramento County Treasury Oversight Committee

In accordance with California Government Code section 27130 et seq., the Board of Supervisors, in consultation with the Director of Finance, has created the Sacramento County Treasury Oversight Committee (Oversight Committee). Annually, the Director of Finance shall prepare an Investment Policy that will be forwarded to and monitored by the Oversight Committee and rendered to Boards of all local agency participants. The Board of Supervisors shall review and approve the Policy during public session. Quarterly, the Director of Finance shall provide the Oversight Committee a report of all investment activities of the Pooled Investment Fund to ensure compliance to the Policy. Annually, the Oversight Committee shall cause an audit to be conducted on the Pooled Investment Fund. The meetings of the Oversight Committee shall be open to the public and subject to the Ralph M. Brown Act.

A member of the Oversight Committee may not be employed by an entity that has contributed to the campaign of a candidate for the office of local treasurer, or contributed to the campaign of a candidate to be a member of a legislative body of any local agency that has deposited funds in the county treasury, in the previous three years or during the period that the employee is a member of the Oversight Committee. A member may not directly or indirectly raise money for a candidate for local treasurer or a member of the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors or governing board of any local agency that has deposited funds in the county treasury while a member of the Oversight Committee. Finally, a member may not secure employment with, or be employed by bond underwriters, bond counsel, security brokerages or dealers, or financial services firms, with whom the treasurer is doing business during the period that the person is a member of the Oversight Committee or for one year after leaving the committee.

The Oversight Committee is not allowed to direct individual investment decisions, select individual investment advisors, brokers or dealers, or impinge on the day-to-day operations of the Department of Finance treasury and investment operations.

IX. Investment Parameters

A. Investable Funds

Total Investable Funds (TIF) for purposes of this Policy are all Pooled Investment Fund moneys that are available for investment at any one time, including the estimated bank account float. Included in TIF are funds of outside investors, if applicable, for which the Director of Finance provides investment services. Excluded from TIF are all funds held in separate portfolios.

The Cash Flow Horizon is the period in which the Pooled Investment Fund cash flow can be reasonably forecasted. This Policy establishes the Cash Flow Horizon to be one (1) year.

Once the Director of Finance has deemed that the cash flow forecast can be met, the Director of Finance may invest funds with maturities beyond one year. These securities will be referred to as the Core Portfolio.

B. Authorized Investments

Authorized investments shall match the general categories established by the California Government Code sections 53601 et seq. and 53635 et seq. Authorized investments shall include, in accordance with California Government Code section 16429.1, investments into LAIF. Authorization for specific instruments within these general categories, as well as narrower portfolio concentration and maturity limits, will be established and maintained by the Investment Group as part of the Investment Guidelines. As the California Government Code is amended, this Policy shall likewise become amended.

C. Prohibited Investments

No investments shall be authorized that have the possibility of returning a zero or negative yield if held to maturity. These shall include inverse floaters, range notes, and interest only strips derived from a pool of mortgages.

All legal investments issued by a tobacco-related company are prohibited. A tobacco-related company is defined as an entity that makes smoking products from tobacco used in cigarettes, cigars, or snuff or for smoking in pipes. The tobacco-related issuers restricted from any investment are any component companies in the Dow Jones U.S. Tobacco Index or the NYSE Arca Tobacco Index. Annually the Director of Finance and/or his designee will update the list of tobacco-related companies.

D. Credit Requirements

Except for municipal obligations and Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) bank deposits and certificates of deposit, the issuer's short-term credit ratings shall be at or above A-1 by Standard & Poor's, P-1 by Moody's, and, if available, F1 by Fitch, and the issuer's long-term credit ratings shall be at or above A by Standard & Poor's, A2 by Moody's, and, if available, A by Fitch. There are no credit requirements for Registered State Warrants. All other municipal obligations shall be at or above a short-term rating of SP-1 by Standard & Poor's, MIG1 by Moody's, and, if available, F1 by Fitch. In addition, domestic banks are limited to those with a Fitch Viability rating of a or better, without regard to modifiers. The Investment Group is granted the authority to specify approved California banks with Fitch Viability ratings of bbb+ but they must have a Support rating of a or better, without regard to modifiers; however, a foreign bank may have a rating of bbb+ but they must have a Support rating of a or better, without regard to modifiers; however, a foreign bank may have a rating of bbb+ but they must have a Support rating of 1. Community Reinvestment Act Program Credit Requirements

Eligible banks must have Community Reinvestment Act performance ratings of "satisfactory" or "outstanding" from each financial institution's regulatory authority. In addition, deposits greater than the federally-insured amount must be collateralized. Banks must place securities worth between 110% and 150% of the value of the deposit with the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco, the Home Loan Bank of San Francisco, or a trust bank.

Since credit unions do not have Community Reinvestment Act performance ratings, they must demonstrate their commitment to meeting the community reinvestment lending and charitable activities, which are also required of banks.

All commercial paper and medium-term note issues must be issued by corporations operating within the United States and having total assets in excess of one billion dollars (\$1,000,000,000).

The Investment Group may raise these credit standards as part of the Investment Guidelines and Approved Lists. Appendix A provides a Comparison and Interpretation of Credit Ratings by Standard & Poor's, Moody's, and Fitch.

E. Maximum Maturities

Due to the nature of the invested funds, no investment with limited market liquidity should be used. Appropriate amounts of highly-liquid investments, such as Treasury and Agency securities, should be maintained to accommodate unforeseen withdrawals.

The maximum maturity, determined as the term from the date of ownership to the date of maturity, for each investment shall be established as follows:

The Investment Group may reduce these maturity limits to a shorter term as part of the Investment Guidelines and the Approved Lists.

The ultimate maximum maturity of any investment shall be five (5) years. The dollar-weighted average maturity of all securities shall be equal to or less than three (3) years.

F. Maximum Concentrations

No more than 80% of the portfolio may be invested in issues other than United States Treasuries and Government Agencies. The maximum allowable percentage for each type of security is set forth as follows:

The Investment Group may reduce these concentrations as part of the Investment Guidelines and the Approved Lists.

¹ The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, International Finance Corporation, and Inter-American Development Bank.

No more than 10% of the portfolio, except Treasuries and Agencies, may be invested in securities of a single issuer including its related entities.

Where a percentage limitation is established above, for the purpose of determining investment compliance, that maximum percentage will be applied on the date of purchase.

G. Repurchase Agreements

Under California Government Code section 53601, paragraph (j) and section 53635, the Director of Finance may enter into Repurchase Agreements and Reverse Repurchase Agreements. The maximum maturity of a Repurchase Agreement shall be one year. The maximum maturity of a reverse repurchase agreement shall be 92 days, and the proceeds of a reverse repurchase agreement may not be invested beyond the expiration of the agreement. The reverse repurchase agreement must be "matched to maturity" and meet all other requirements in the code.

All repurchase agreements must have an executed Sacramento County Master Repurchase Agreement on file with both the Director of Finance and the Broker/Dealer. Repurchase Agreements executed with approved broker-dealers must be collateralized with either: (1) U.S. Treasuries or Agencies with a market value of 102% for collateral marked to market daily; or (2) money market instruments which are on the Approved Lists of the County and which meet the qualifications of the Policy, with a market value of 102%. Since the market value of the underlying securities is subject to daily market fluctuations, investments in repurchase agreements shall be in compliance if the value of the underlying securities is brought back up to 102% no later than the next business day. Use of mortgage-backed securities for collateral is not permitted. Strictly for purposes of investing the daily excess bank balance, the collateral provided by the Sacramento County's depository bank can be Treasuries or Agencies valued at 110%, or mortgage-backed securities valued at 150%.

H. Community Reinvestment Act Program

The Director of Finance has allocated within the Pooled Investment Fund, a maximum of \$90 million for the Community Reinvestment Act Program to encourage community investment by financial institutions, which includes community banks and credit unions, and to acknowledge and reward local financial institutions which support the community's financial needs. The Director of Finance may increase this amount, as appropriate, while staying within the investment policy objectives and maximum maturity and concentration limits. The eligible banks and savings banks must have Community Reinvestment Act performance ratings of "satisfactory" or "outstanding" from each financial institution's regulatory authority. The minimum credit requirements are located on page 5 of Section IX.D.

I. Criteria and Qualifications of Brokers/Dealers and Direct Issuers

All transactions initiated on behalf of the Pooled Investment Fund and Sacramento County shall be executed through either government security dealers reporting as primary dealers to the Market Reports Division of the Federal Reserve Bank of New York or direct issuers that directly issue their own securities which have been placed on the Approved List of

brokers/dealers and direct issuers. Further, these firms must have an investment grade rating from at least two national rating services, if available.

Brokers/Dealers and direct issuers which have exceeded the political contribution limits, as contained in Rule G-37 of the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, within the preceding four-year period to the Director of Finance, any member of the Board of Supervisors, or any candidate for the Board of Supervisors, are prohibited from the Approved List of brokers/dealers and direct issuers.

Each broker/dealer and direct issuer will be sent a copy of this Policy and a list of those persons authorized to execute investment transactions. Each firm must acknowledge receipt of such materials to qualify for the Approved List of brokers/dealers and direct issuers.

Each broker/dealer and direct issuer authorized to do business with Sacramento County shall, at least annually, supply the Director of Finance with audited financial statements.

J. Investment Guidelines, Management Style and Strategy

The Investment Group, named by the Director of Finance, shall issue and maintain Investment Guidelines specifying authorized investments, credit requirements, permitted transactions, and issue maturity and concentration limits which are consistent with this Policy.

The Investment Group shall also issue a statement describing the investment management style and current strategy for the entire investment program. The management style and strategy car be changed to accommodate shifts in the financial markets, but at all times they must be consistent with this Policy and its objectives.

K. Approved Lists

The Investment Group, named by the Director of Finance, shall issue and maintain various Approved Lists. These lists are:

- 1. Approved Domestic Banks for all legal investments.
- 2. Approved Foreign Banks for all legal investments.
- 3. Approved Commercial Paper and Medium Term Note Issuers.
- 4. Approved Money Market Mutual Funds.
- 5. Approved Firms for Purchase or Sale of Securities (Brokers/Dealers and Direct Issuers).
- 6. Approved Banks / Credit Unions for the Community Reinvestment Act Program.

L. Calculation of Yield and Costs

The costs of managing the investment portfolio, including but not limited to: investment management; accounting for the investment activity; custody of the assets; managing and accounting for the banking; receiving and remitting deposits; oversight controls; and indirect and overhead expenses are charged to the investment earnings based upon actual labor hours worked in respective areas. Costs of these respective areas are accumulated by specific cost

accounting projects and charged to the Pooled Investment Fund on a quarterly basis throughout the fiscal year.

The Department of Finance will allocate the net interest earnings of the Pooled Investment Fund quarterly. The net interest earnings are allocated based upon the average daily cash balance of each Pooled Investment Fund participant.

X. Reviewing, Monitoring and Reporting of the Portfolio

The Review Group will prepare and present to the Director of Finance at least monthly a comprehensive review and evaluation of the transactions, positions, performance of the Pooled Investment Fund and compliance to the California Government Code, Policy, and Investment Guidelines.

Quarterly, the Director of Finance will provide to the Oversight Committee and to any local agency participant that requests a copy, a detailed report on the Pooled Investment Fund. Pursuant to California Government Code section 53646, the report will list the type of investments, name of issuer, maturity date, par and dollar amount of the investment. For the total Pooled Investment Fund, the report will list average maturity, the market value, and the pricing source. Additionally, the report will show any funds under the management of contracting parties, a statement of compliance to the Policy and a statement of the Pooled Investment Fund's ability to meet the expected expenditure requirements for the next six months.

Each quarter, the Director of Finance shall provide to the Board of Supervisors and interested parties a comprehensive report on the Pooled Investment Fund.

Annually, the Director of Finance shall provide to the Oversight Committee the Investment Policy. Additionally, the Director of Finance will render a copy of the Investment Policy to the legislative body of the local agencies that participate in the Pooled Investment Fund.

XI. Withdrawal Requests for Pooled Fund Investors

The Director of Finance will honor all requests to withdraw funds for normal cash flow purposes that are approved by the Director of Finance at a one dollar net asset value. Any requests to withdraw funds for purposes other than immediate cash flow needs, such as for external investing, are subject to the consent of the Director of Finance. In accordance with California Government Code Sections 27133(h) and 27136, such requests for withdrawals must first be made in writing to the Director of Finance. When evaluating a request to withdraw funds, the Director of Finance will take into account the effect of a withdrawal on the stability and predictability of the Pooled Investment Fund and the interests of other depositors. Any withdrawal for such purposes will be at the market value of the Pooled Investment Fund on the date of the withdrawal.

XII. Limits on Honoraria, Gifts, and Gratuities

In accordance with California Government Code Section 27133(d), this Policy establishes limits for the Director of Finance; individuals responsible for management of the portfolios; and members of the Investment Group and Review Group who direct individual investment decisions,

select individual investment advisors and broker/dealers, and conduct day-to-day investment trading activity. The limits also apply to members of the Oversight Committee. Any individual who receives an aggregate total of gifts, honoraria and gratuities in excess of \$50 in a calendar year from a broker/dealer, bank or service provider to the Pooled Investment Fund must report the gifts, dates and firms to the designated filing official and complete the appropriate State forms.

No individual may receive aggregate gifts, honoraria, and gratuities from any single source in a calendar year in excess of the amount specified in Section 18940.2(a) of Title 2, Division 6 of the California Code of Regulations. This limitation is \$500 for the period January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2020, and is adjusted for inflation every odd-numbered year. Any violation must be reported to the State Fair Political Practices Commission.

XIII. Terms and Conditions for Outside Investors

Outside investors may invest in the Pooled Investment Fund through California Government Code Section 53684. Their deposits are subject to the consent of the Director of Finance. The legislative body of the local agency must approve the Sacramento County Pooled Investment Fund as an authorized investment and execute a Memorandum of Understanding. Any withdrawal of these deposits must be made in writing 30 days in advance and will be paid based upon the market value of the Pooled Investment Fund. If the Director of Finance considers it appropriate, the deposits may be returned at any time to the local agency.

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
